January

We participated in the first ever national 'Lose the Booths' event at Carr Manor School, in Leeds, discussing the use of isolation booths in schools.

February

We wrote our 'frequently asked questions on abolition and school exclusions' resource.

We started a partnership with Pupil Power!

We collaborated with Kids of Colour and NPMG on a school to prison pipeline event.

March

Our first parliamentary question was asked in the House of Lords, after a discussion with the Coalition of Race Equality Organisations.

April

We submitted evidence on the impact of COVID-19 on people from Black/Global majority communities, Disabled communities and women to the House of Commons.

NME held a talk on the discrimination young Black children face in schools and trauma.
